This week's lesson is an examination of our motives. The topics discussed here are relevant no matter what your spiritual gift may be. Don't be afraid to be vulnerable, real, and transparent with the group about your own struggles and temptations.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why is it important not to pretend that God has revealed more to you than He actually has?
- 2. What is the difference between the Word of Knowledge and human intuition?
- 3. What are some ways that people often grant access to a spirit of divination?
- 4. What problems can arise from focusing on the responses of people, regardless of whether they are positive or negative?
- 5. Define performance orientation. At first glance, striving to do things with perfection seems good. Why is performance orientation actually a bad thing?
- 6. What is the solution for dealing with pride?
- 7. Read Philippians 2:1-16. What does this passage tell us about how to practice our Christianity? How could we apply this passage to practicing the gift of a Word of Knowledge?

Application:

Read to the Group: A small group setting is an ideal place for healthy relationships and genuine fellowship to flourish. One of the most healthy practices is confession of sin.

Read 1 John 5:1-10 and James 5:16. Why is confession important?

Now read 2 Corinthians 5:17-20 and John 20:21-23. Forgiveness comes from God and is only possible through Jesus Christ. But according to these verses, whose responsibility is it to express that forgiveness?

Take some time to confess sin to each other. Do not respond with counseling. Rather, simply say, "In Jesus' name, you're forgiven."
